These two lines are puzzling. Madden in his Corrections proposes that for And we should, no doubt, read In. The emendation does not improve matters greatly, but it may be adopted. The meaning seems to be: If what I said to him (Kay) plainly in his presence, has caused my lord (Arthur) to be displeased. 178. Kepitthe king, went to meet the king. This is a rare meaning of the verb, found mostly in Northern works. Cf. Life of St Cuthbert, 1....
