

I have tried it on a number of engines, both small and large, and in every case was pleased with the results. Using the ordinary bolt, just turn down a portion of the shank between the head and the threads to about the diameter of the base of the threads, leaving a fillet under the head as large as possible. If new bolts are to be made, an even larger fillet can be provided and a little countersinking done in the hole over several inches of its length to relieve the excessive strains close up under the head. I have a bolt working that has been in a year and a half, where...
